**Prof. Dr. Linn Washington, Temple University, Philadelphia on
US-Journalism, the Death Penalty and Mumia Abu-Jamal**



This African American journalist from Philadelphia has written for leading newspapers over the last 30 years, including the *Philadelphia Tribune*, the oldest black newspaper in the USA.

He teaches journalism at Temple University. His focus is on justice, police violence, and racism and the resulting discrimination.

He also examines the different reception of such news items in “white” and “black” media.

He is the only one to have reported continually about Mumia Abu-Jamal, who was sentenced to death for allegedly having killed a police officer in 1982.

For his round trip in Germany which includes events in Heidelberg, Freiburg, and Berlin, he has visited Mumia Abu-Jamal on death row in early February and will thus be able to supply brand-new information, including the present state of Abu-Jamal’s appeals process which is now entering its critical phase.
