## **The U.S. News, Media and Blacks**



Prof. Linn Washington Jr. is a Black American journalist from Philadelphia who teaches journalism at Temple University, Philadelphia.

He is author of the critically acclaimed book “Black Judges on Justice” and the forthcoming book on police brutality: “The Beat(ing) Goes On.”

He also examines the different reception of such news items in “white” and “black” media.

Moreover, he is the only one to have reported continually about Mumia Abu-Jamal, a radical Black journalist who was sentenced to death for allegedly having killed a police officer in 1982.

For his round trip in Germany which includes events in Heidelberg, Freiburg, and Berlin, he has visited Mumia Abu-Jamal on death row in early February and will thus be able to supply brand-new information, including the present state of Abu-Jamal’s appeals process which is now entering its critical phase.
